Friday 17th October: PUBLIC LECTURE at 8pm

'Life at the early Jung Institute'. Speaker: **David Hart**, Jungian Analyst Boston, MA. David Hart analyzed with both Emma Jung and Toni Wolff. He is a Founding Member of the Pennsylvania Association of Jungian Analysts, and teaches trainees at the Boston Jung Institute.

Saturday 18th October: Clinical Seminar 10am - 1pm.

'The Water of Life' - Exploration of a Fairytale. Presenter: **David Hart** assisted by his wife **Demaris S. Wehr**. David will explore the spiritual aspect of the fairytale 'Water of Life' from Grimm's Fairytale. Participants are requested to read the fairytale in advance. Friday 14th November: PUBLIC LECTURE at 8pm.

'Jung and Nature'. Speaker: **Julian David**, Jungian Analyst, UK. That there are not two things, matter and spirit, but two aspects of one thing, is becoming increasingly evident. For Jung, the question of whether a person is connected with something eternal or not, is the decisive question of a life-time. Julian David is Zurich-trained, a founder member of IGAP and SAAJA. He practices from his home in Devon, is the current Chairman of the Jung Club of London and Editor of 'Harvest'.

'Active Imagination'. Presenter: **Julian David**, Jungian Analyst, UK.

Social Event and film presentation: *'I was Sabina Spielrein'* - a film about the tangled relationships between Jung, Spielrein and Freud, and an evocation of the early days of psychoanalysis. There is no entry fee for this event.

Friday 16th January: PUBLIC LECTURE at 8pm.

'Coherent Themes: The Matrix of Music and Analysis'. Speaker: **Patricia Skar**, BMus, MFA. Patricia Skar, BMus, MFA, is a Zurich-trained Jungian analyst in Stratford-upon-Avon, U.K. She has taught Jungian theory and lectured widely on music and analysis in both clinical and academic settings, and has published several articles on Jungian topics, including 'The goal as process: music and the search for the Self' (Journal of Analytical Psychology 47/4, 2002).

Saturday 17th January: Clinical Seminar 10 am -1pm.

'Music in dreams and active imagination'. Presenter: **Patricia Skar**. Following on the material presented in her lecture, Patricia Skar will discuss the symbolism of music in dreams, and explain how she has used improvisation with simple percussion instruments as a form of active imagination within analysis.

Friday 13th February: PUBLIC LECTURE at 8pm.

'Pauli, Jung, and Clinical Practice: The New Physics and the Therapeutic Dance'. Speaker: **Therese Hicks**. Making meaning of our experience, whether that be the calculations of quantum physics or the material which emerges in the consulting room, is the ongoing challenge of being human. This lecture engages the notions of archetype, collective unconscious, relationship between psyche and matter, and alchemy. Therese Hicks, MIAHIP, is a Counsellor/Therapist with the HSE. She has MAs in Counselling Psychology and Theology, and is also writing a book on meaning-making in contemporary spirituality.

Friday 6th March: Teaching Seminar at 7:30pm (Note different time)

'Making Connections between the Science of the Mind and the Therapy of the Psyche'. (Part One of a three-part Series) Speaker: **Julie Kelly B.Sc., M.Sc., M.Phil., Ph.D.** Over the course of three two hour seminars, connections between psychoanalytic concepts and knowledge generated by scientific studies will be explored. Connections will be considered with particular reference to models of the mind. Dr. Julie Kelly has a formal background in biochemistry and neuroscience, in addition to qualifications in Counselling, Psychotherapy, and Psychoanalytic Studies. She researches and lectures on the relationships between psychoanalytic theory and neuroscience.

'Ethical Decision Making'. Presenter: **Brian Howlett**. BA(Hons), FCA, MIAHIP, MBASRT, AccSRPsyT, MIACT, ECP. A workshop on the process and practice of ethical decision-making in the therapeutic setting. Brian Howlett, Director of the Dublin Counselling Centre, is a Gestalt therapist with a background in couples counselling. He has considerable experience in the training and supervision of counsellors and psychotherapists and of clinical supervision.

'North by North West' - Compass points of the soul and bipolar disorder.' Presenter: **Richard Blennerhassett**. This seminar will explore current psychiatric perspectives on bipolar disorder and seek the guidance of Dr Carl Jung along the way. Dr Richard Blennerhassett is a Consultant Psychiatrist and Clinical Director of St Ita's Hospital, Portrane, Co Dublin. He is Senior Lecturer in Psychiatry at the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland. He was a major contributor to the acclaimed documentary *The Asylum*, screened by RTE in 2005. He has an ongoing interest in seeking to integrate a psychiatric and Jungian perspective in his practice.

'The Adversary: Opposition and Change in the Psyche.' Speaker: **Jim Fitzgerald**. The figure of the Adversary or Antagonist appears from the earliest times in the myths of many cultures. His emergence in the collective or the individual psyche signifies the constellation of a conflict. The possibilities for radical change which his appearance suggests will also be considered. Jim Fitzgerald trained at the CG Jung Institute in Zurich and is in private practice in London. His background is in Ancient Classics and Byzantine Greek, followed by a career in primary school teaching. He is a former Chairman of the CG Jung Psychology Club in London.

Saturday 25th April: Clinical Seminar 10 am -1pm. Galway venue

'The Adversary: Opposition and change in the Psyche'. Presenter: **Jim Fitzgerald**. The seminar will examine case material related to the figure of the adversary in the psyche. How such forces operate in life and in analysis in order to bring about change will be considered.

Friday 8th May: PUBLIC LECTURE at 8pm.

'The Power of Companionship; the Psychology of the Brother-Sister relationship'. Speaker: **Lara Newton**. The sibling relationship, both externally in the world of inter-personal and cultural relationships and internally in the relationship between conscious and unconscious, masculine and feminine, is examined as a process of transformation, from bonding, to wounding, and finally to healing and redemption. **Lara Newton** is the President of the Jung Society of Colorado, Co-ordinator of Training at the CG Jung Institute of Colorado and also maintains a private practice as a Jungian Analyst.

Saturday 9th May: Clinical Seminar 10am - 4pm

'The Power of Companionship'. Presenter: **Lara Newton**. Focussing on specific patterns in dark and troublesome brother-sister relationships, the process of transformation will be discussed. We will work with three brother-sister fairytales, (provided in advance). Participants are encouraged to bring dreams as well as life stories for the discussion.
